


Figure 1-3: A221 Base Station connectors.

he A221 Base Station is pre-configured for use as a base station in an RTK system. The provided kit includes everything you need to set up and begin using your base station.

#### **Mounting the A221 Base Station**

Mount the A221 Base Station to the tripod using the provided tripod adapter.

#### To mount the A221 Base Station:

- Thread the provided tripod stem (676-0018) onto the tripod adapter (676-0019).
- 2. Mount the tripod adapter unit onto the tripod.





3. Thread the center hole of the base station onto the tripod stem.



#### **Powering the A221 Base Station**

Connect the A221 Base Station to a car battery (110 V) using the supplied power cable. The base station is automatically "on" upon connecting a power source.

#### To connect a power source to the A221 Base Station:

- 1. Connect the provided power cable (054-0119) to the A221 Base Station's power port.
- Attach the positive and negative leads at the opposite end of the power cable to a car battery's positive and negative terminals.

3. Check the LED status on the base station. The red LED indicates power and a successful connection.



#### **Using the Menus**

The A221 Base Station menu screens are simple to use. For a complete menu map, see "Appendix B: Menu Map".

#### **Navigating the Menus**

On startup, the A221 Base Station will display the main menu screen. You can access all of the setup menus from the **Main** menu.

#### To navigate the menus:

Use the up and down arrow keys to scroll through the available options in each menu. Use the green arrow button to select an option. To return to the **Main** menu screen, use the arrow key to scroll down and select **Top Menu**.

#### **Entering Alphanumeric Characters**

Use the arrow keys to enter alphanumeric characters (for example, when entering a job name or a subscription code).

#### **Operating the A221 Base Station**

Follow the steps below to begin using the base station:

- Plan the base station location. The base station automatically uses its current location as the reference point. Place the base station:
  - at least 1 meter (3 feet) away from the rover radio, with an unobstructed view of the sky, and
  - at least 50 meters (160 feet) from any obstructions.




Figure 2-3: Location of the base station.

Select the desired radio channel. The base station and rover radios must be set to the same channel.

#### To select the radio channel:

**Note**: It takes 3 - 5 minutes for the base station to achieve RTK lock in an unknown location.

It typically takes the base station less than 60 seconds to achieve RTK lock in a known location.




#### **Configuration Wizard Menu**


#### **Data Logging Menu**


#### **SBAS Menu**

Use the **SBAS** menu to view differential signal status.




# **GPS Menu**

Use the **GPS** menu to view position status, individual satellite data, or to change GPS settings, such as the elevation mask or maximum DGPS age.





The Outback A221 ESP (U.S. and Canada only) applies only to the non-software portions of the electronic components of the product, including the console and related cables. Coverage for the mechanical portions of the Outback A221 is described in the warranty notice. The limited plan term is one-year standard, or three-years extended if purchased at the time of the original order, beginning on the date of invoice to the original purchaser.

Damage caused by shipping the product(s) to the original purchaser is covered under this limited plan. Otherwise, this limited plan does not cover damage due to external causes, including accident, abuse, misuse, problems with electrical power, servicing not authorized by Hemisphere GPS, usage not in accordance with product instructions, failure to perform required preventive maintenance and problems caused by use of parts and components not supplied by Hemisphere GPS.

This limited plan does not cover any items that are in one or more of the following categories: software (except for Hemisphere GPS authorized revision updates), external devices (except as specifically noted), accessories or parts added to an Outback A221 system after the system is shipped from Hemisphere GPS, accessories or parts that are not installed in the Hemisphere GPS factory.

Hemisphere GPS will provide, on an exchange basis and subject to the Hemisphere GPS Exchange Policy in effect on the date of the exchange, replacement parts (up to and including a complete Outback A221 system) for the Outback A221 product(s) covered under this limited plan when parts require replacement. To request service, you must call Hemisphere GPS (U.S. 800-247-3808, Canada 866-888-4472) or go to outbackguidance.com for information, within the plan period. If replacement is required, Hemisphere GPS will issue a Return Material Authorization Number and will ship by UPS Next Day Air & Saturday Delivery the replacement part(s) within 1 business day. You must ship by UPS Ground Service collect, the original product(s) back to

Hemisphere GPS in this packaging. For Canadian customers, Saturday delivery is not available and the shipping carrier is Purolator.

In any instance in which Hemisphere GPS issues a Return Material Authorization Number, Hemisphere GPS must receive the original part(s) prior to the expiration of the plan period in order for the replacement(s) to be covered by the limited plan. Failure to return original part(s), for which replacement(s) have been sent, within 30 days of initial shipment, will result in the issuance of an invoice for the cost of the sent part(s). Failure to pay the invoice, or return the part(s), will result in cancellation of this limited plan.
